Addresses discrimination, prejudice, and social barriers among young people in Europe.

Through art, participants will explore issues of **tolerance, diversity, and inclusion**, using artistic expression as a powerful tool to initiate dialogue and inspire change.

Participants will join international artistic workshops, discovering different art forms and methods of creative expression, including visual arts, theatre, art therapy, digital media, and multimedia storytelling. They will also engage in meaningful discussions and activities designed to deepen their understanding of emotional health, self-expression, and social awareness. The project includes training on effectively using social media platforms to spread positive social messages and promote their artistic creations.

Throughout the project, participants will regularly reflect on their progress and experiences in supportive **"Spirit Groups,"** fostering empathy, teamwork, and intercultural communication. The experience will culminate in a public exhibition at Silesian Park, showcasing participants' artwork and providing them with an empowering platform to share their insights on tolerance, diversity, and social equality with the wider community.

Prior to the exchange we would like the Youth Leaders to participate in an online preparation session to learn about tools and techniques that help participants monitor their progress and reflect effectively during the project. Additionally, we encourage each Youth Leader to prepare at least one energizer and one integration game
